The most common risk for Wernicke-Korsakoff syndrome is alcohol abuse, but it can also be triggered by AIDS, cancer, chronic infections, kidney dialysis, anorexia and the inability of the body to absorb nutrients from food. If this syndrome is caused by alcoholism, it is known as Alcoholic Korsakoff's Syndrome, on the other hand, if the disease comes with the much less obvious Wernicke encephalopathy it is known as Wernicke-Korsakoff Syndrome. Otherwise, it is known as Non-Alcoholic Korsakoff Syndrome.
