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Target for benzodiazepines. The ionotropic GABA A receptor protein complex is also the molecular target of the benzodiazepine class of tranquilizer drugs. Benzodiazepines do not bind to the same receptor site on the protein complex as the endogenous ligand GABA (whose binding site is located between α - and β -subunits), but bind to distinct benzodiazepine binding sites situated at the ...

A subclass of ionotropic GABA receptors, insensitive to typical allosteric modulators of GABA A receptor channels such as benzodiazepines and barbiturates, was designated GABA C receptor. Native responses of the GABA C receptor type occur in retinal bipolar or horizontal cells across vertebrate species.. Results. Highly anxious rats were accompanied by the deficiency of gephyrin palmitoylation and decreased the synaptic function of GABA A R in the BLA. We then identified that the dysfunction of DHHC12, a palmitoyl acyltransferase that specifically palmitoylates gephyrin, contributed to the high-anxious state.

Benzodiazepine anticonvulsants refer to those benzodiazepines that are also effective at controlling or preventing convulsions or seizures.. All benzodiazepines act on gamma-aminobutyric acid-A (GABA-A) receptors, but there are several different GABA-A receptor subtypes.
